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		<p>Authority.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social determinants of health: consider cultural <i>responsiveness</i> in addition to cultural competence. Consider including something about trauma-informed care. Strategy to identify gaps within the new OHP membership or eligible population of undocumented Oregonians. Rural CCO’s experience higher costs to start up programs or projects, suggestion to look at this. Important to build in flexibility to be able to do what works in our community based on our size and needs. Some promising practices are working and flourishing in rural areas, but they may not be evidence-based practices. Acknowledgement that the K12 population needs to be addressed in the policy options as well.</li> <li>• Behavioral health: finding ways to engage families of children who need these services but don’t believe they need them. For example, the inclusive child care program and all the requirements that the child needs to meet to qualify for the services. Schools are dealing a lot with socio-emotion issues and it would help to be able to train child care and preschool providers. DESA is a program that Willamina SD is using to screen kids and identify the neediest ones and it identifies what each child’s needs are and suggests lessons to address those needs. Suggestion to integrate behavioral supports within the schools and incentivize it. Education of what infant, toddler, and preschooler mental health looks like, what is just a phase and what is a disorder or illness. Suggestion to have funds available to hire mental health therapists for early intervention and relief nurseries. Suggestion to have additional support for families who don’t qualify for services and being able to follow up with them to connect them with other resources. Concern that if funds are blended and braided for special education, the special education needs population will be pushed out or not given priority.</li> <li>• Value-based payment: include in maternity care something about family planning. Finding a way to blend the well-child check with the maternal check to discuss effective contraception use.</li> </ul> <p>OHA also welcomes group recommendations on behalf of the ELC.</p>		<p><b>Stephanie Jarem</b></p>
