Most surveyed families live and work in McMinnville.

81% of families identify as White, 17% identify as Hispanic/Latinx.

Child's home language: 92% English, 4% Spanish, 4% Bilingual

28% of families have a child 0 to 2 years old

41% of families have a child 3 to 5 years old

75% of families have a child 6+ years old



11% of families have income =<135% FPL 34% of families have income =<200% FPL

45% of families have income =<250% FPL *FPL or Federal Poverty Level

17% of families have a child with an IFSP or IEP

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This research included a compressed child care feasibility study to inform upcoming expansion planning by Yamhill County, Yamhill CCO and its Early Learning Hub, and Child Care Resource & Referral. Input was provided by families and businesses located in Yamhill County and the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde.

91% of families rely on their personal vehicle to access child care

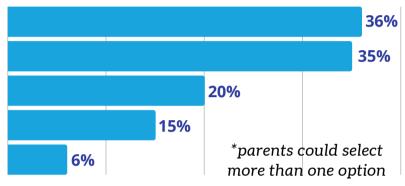


36% of parents consider their child care costs to be unaffordable.



CHILD CARE COST P/MONTH

Center-based care (preschool, HeadStart, etc.) Care in child's home by relative Care in family or home-based program Care in relative's home by relative Care in child's home by non-relative



- 35% prefer caring for their own child
 - **31%** prefer center-based care
- 18% prefer relative care in child's home
- **10% or less** prefer family or home-based programs, relative care in relative's home, non-relative care in child's home
- 63% of parents prefer full-day care
- **50%** of parents prefer school-day care
- <10% of parents prefer evening, weekend or holiday care

IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON FAMILIES AND BUSINESSES (n = 239



44% of families report their work location changed and work hours increased or decreased.

28% of parents are currently working full-time at their employment site and **51%** of parents anticipate this arrangement post-COVID.

68% of 41 businesses report the child care shortage has impacted employee attendance



49% of 239 families have missed work 3+ times in the last 6 months to care for their child/children



Only **34%** of 188 families with children 6+ years old access care for their school-aged child now
